During the Shaukat Khanum journey, many impossibles have turned into realities. You may have heard from Mr. Imran Khan that the very idea of a modern cancer centre in a developing country was viewed with scepticism even by many leading medical professionals of the day. This was echoed by one of the earliest senior executives hired for the hospital who felt that while the hospital had been built, it would not survive if more than a small percentage of its patients were offered free treatment. Yet, here we are, 30 years on with two functional hospitals, a third one under construction – and over 75% of cancer patients on supported or free

treatment. All because of the generosity of our donors and supporters. When we started building a hospital information system for our


When we started building a hospital information system for our institutional needs, I saw similar scepticism from various quarters, but our team of dedicated IT professionals, with the help of end-users, have developed a system that not only powers our work in

clinical, administrative and financial domains but also helps to automate a number of hospitals and health systems in the country. There are many firsts for us including the first PET-CT and training programmes in nursing oncology and in a number of disciplines of medicine and surgery that started at Shaukat Khanum, a reflection of the can-do in the organisation.

I remember the day when I held the plans for the future research laboratory – but with no money in sight for it – the estimate was 30 million rupees. While I was mulling where to get the money, the phone rang and one of our marketing colleagues asked if I had a project for around 30 million rupees! The donor wished it to be spent for sadqa-e-jaaaria – what greater sadqa-e-jaaaria than research, and that is what made the Abdul Hafeez Cancer Research Wing a reality! Once again, thanks to a donor who donated her inheritance for this work.

A childhood cancer survivor Registered on December 29th 1994

At the age of 11, my life was suddenly turned upside down, when I was diagnosed with cancer. A freak accident led to my diagnosis, after I was hit on my shoulder by a door, prompting an X-ray that revealed a bony tumour. I underwent surgery at a local hospital, but, fortunately for me, Pakistan's first specialist cancer hospital, the Shaukat Khanum Memorial Cancer Hospital and Research Centre (SKMCH&RC), was opening in Lahore at almost exactly the same time. I registered at the Hospital on the day of its inauguration, the 29th of December, 1994.

I can remember to this day the mixture of fear, uncertainty and hope that filled me that day, as well as the optimism that the staff instilled in me and which helped carry me through my treatment. I was fortunate in that my cancer was diagnosed at an early stage. The prospect of chemotherapy treatment was daunting, but the support, care and love I received at SKMCH&RC made it all so much easier to bear.

Even in those early days, the Hospital went to great lengths to make cancer treatment less frightening for children and their parents, and I look back fondly on the regular parties and melas that were held for children with cancer. Many times, the founder of the Hospital, Imran Khan, attended these and I was also lucky to meet the late Diana, Princess of Wales, at one such event.

Today, I have not only beaten cancer but am myself a doctor, and a proud mother of two. The care and support I received at SKMCH&RC and the love and prayers of my family are what carried me through this. Every day, I wake up thankful for the opportunities I have been given as a result - a new life to enjoy with my own family, the ability to help others and the good fortune to be able to contribute, in some small way, towards ensuring that Imran Khan's dream of making world-class cancer care available to everyone in our country, becomes a reality. Shaukat Khanum was instrumental in making this new life possible for me, thirty years ago, when cancer was considered a death sentence.

I shall always remember coming in for my first day, the 1st of December, 1994 and being taken to see two empty and unfinished rooms with bare walls, which I was told was to be the Endoscopy Unit. Most doctors start work at an established hospital, and just slot themselves in. I was incredibly lucky to join a month before the Lahore hospital opened, as this allowed me the opportunity to play a small part in the development and commissioning of this incredible facility. There were numerous challenges, including the fact that there was

Another enormous challenge at the outset was that we were denied an electricity connection. For the first seven months of operations, we ran the entire hospital on two large generators. In a building designed for central air-conditioning, in which the windows could not be opened, we worked through the Lahore summer with only a few pedestal fans in our clinics. Many a time, it was unclear whether there would be enough money left to pay staff salaries and, in one particularly difficult period, Imran Khan, who was for the longest time the single largest donor to the Hospital, donated the plot of land he had been given by a grateful nation for winning us the World Cup, so that proceeds from its sale could be used to pay the staff.

The decision to make our second hospital, in Peshawar, in around 2010, afforded me the opportunity to be much more involved in the design, construction and commissioning of this huge project. Today, this hospital offers all the essential cancer diagnostic and treatment

services that we have in Lahore. We achieved Joint Commission International accreditation for Lahore in 2018, and for Peshawar in 2019, and then became only the second organisation in the world to obtain JCI Enterprise accreditation, for our entire organisation, in 2022. These are huge achievements, and testament to the belief that in Pakistan, we can do anything we set our minds to, which imbues our organisation.

Our third, and Pakistan's largest, cancer hospital is currently under construction, in Karachi. The physical structure is complete, and I have no doubt that with the continued support of the people of Pakistan, we will be able to complete, equip and inaugurate this facility so as to be able to continue Imran Khan's dream of providing world class cancer care to all the citizens of Pakistan.

when, while I was counting cash at the outpatient counter, I suddenly heard an almighty bang, which we all

immediately realised was the sound of a bomb going off – in our hospital. Everyone ran out, as did I, to be met by terrible scenes of wounded patients and staff, as well as a large fire in the main outpatient waiting area. I suddenly remembered that I had left the cash unattended. Overcoming my own fear, I ran back inside to retrieve the cash as quickly as possible, and while I am glad that I made it out safely, I believe it was the spirit of Shaukat Khanum, where every rupee given to us is held and spent as sacred trust, which motivated me to put others above myself that day, and continues to do so to this day.

Every day, my team and I handle biopsy samples that reveal whether a patient has cancer or not.

I feel the weight and pain of what these samples represent for a patient and how the hospital remains an inexhaustible source of hope for all who come in contact with it. Our Pathology laboratories are the most advanced, and the busiest, in the country, and I have had tremendous opportunities for growth and advancement, during my time here. Looking at our vibrant campus, and its bustling surroundings today, I can still remember the time when it was surrounded by wheat fields, when it was common to find snakes in the grounds and having to leave for home in convoy, because of the ever-present risk of being robbed once we left the building. Most of us were young – and foolish, perhaps! – but these challenges served only to motivate us to work harder to help establish the organisation and to achieve levels of excellence that were only dreamed of, in Pakistan, until then.


Joined on December 15th 1994

Soon after this, I decided to apply for a job at the new hospital. Friends and family all discouraged me, saying that the hospital would never be built, or that it would not run for long. I was struck by the passion I had seen in Imran Khan that day, and went ahead and joined, because I knew that working here would mean serving the needy. When I first started, I used to work on the *tandoor* (clay oven). The Hospital has trained me and given me opportunities to grow in my profession, and today, I cook meals for admitted patients, including curries and special diets, and it makes me very happy knowing that the meals I prepare help patients with cancer to heal and to recover.
