STORIES OF HOPE

Faiq & Ardil

"My sons, Faiq (12 years old) and Ardil (5 years old) had fever for a week and swelling on their necks when we brought them from Jhang and took them to a hospital in Lahore. They underwent diagnostic tests, including biopsy. We were told to take the biopsy specimens to Shaukat Khanum Memorial Cancer Hospital and Research Centre where we received life-altering results: both of my sons were diagnosed with Hodgkin's lymphoma, a type of cancer. It was a huge shock and that moment instantly changed my priorities.

At Shaukat Khanum Hospital when I was told that my children's cancer was treatable, I felt as if a huge weight was lifted off my chest and I could breathe again. Their treatment started with chemotherapy, which lasted for around eight months. Everyone was professional and compassionate. In early April, during Ramzan this year, our paediatric oncologist gave us the good news that the scans were clear. It was the best Eid that I have ever celebrated with my family without any stress! Despite this challenging situation, my sons made me proud by doing well in recent school exams. The resilience of these children is awe-inspiring.

After serving for twenty-one years in Punjab Police, I had already witnessed a lot of suffering faced by people. I am extremely grateful to Allah for giving my children a second chance at life. It is highly unusual that children of different ages in the same family are diagnosed with Hodgkin's lymphoma at the same time. First-degree relatives (a parent, sibling or child) of people with Hodgkin's lymphoma may have 3-6% increased risk of being diagnosed with Hodgkin's lymphoma as compared to the general population. It is not clear if this is because of a genetic predisposition or shared lifestyle factors. It is extremely challenging for a family to have one child with cancer, let alone two children with cancer at the same time. Fortunately, Shaukat Khanum Hospital takes care of all aspects of care to help ease the burden of cancer for families. Along with all the various modalities of treatment, we also provide psychological counselling for children and parents, meals for admitted patients, play therapy and education through our schooling programme. As part of survivorship care, we also have a long-term follow up clinic to ensure well-being of children who have completed cancer treatment. Faiq and Ardil have now completed treatment and, Masha'Allah, there is no evidence of residual disease.

WORLD NO TOBACCO DAY 2024

Smoking among youth remains prevalent and according to one estimate, 38 million boys and girls aged 13-15 are using some form of tobacco and nicotine products. The theme selected by WHO for this year's World No Tobacco Day is "Protecting children from tobacco industry interference" to bring attention to the tobacco industry's marketing strategies targeted towards youth and to protect our future generations from harmful effects of tobacco use.

Reflecting on this challenge, Dr Faisal Sultan, CEO of Shaukat Khanum Hospitals, says, "Anti-tobacco laws exist in Pakistan but implementation remains a challenge, which can be addressed with awareness. We have credible scientific evidence of the harmful effects of tobacco. We should be wary of the tobacco industry's marketing efforts, which preferentially target people in low- and middle-income countries. The majority of our population is young and where technology makes them vulnerable to misinformation, it also presents an opportunity to intervene for creating awareness. We need to engage our youth using modern technology to fight the tobacco epidemic that kills around eight million people each year. Through our hospital's social media platforms, we highlight the harmful effects of tobacco and we also engage school children in a poster competition each year."

World Health Organization Workshop on Global Initiative for Childhood Cancer

In 2018, the WHO launched the Global Initiative for Childhood Cancer (GICC) with the aim of reaching at least 60% survival rate for children with cancer. In the Eastern Mediterranean Region (EMR), Pakistan was chosen as a focus country. In March this year, the WHO Eastern Mediterranean Region Workshop on Global Initiative for Childhood Cancer was organised in Egypt. Representing Pakistan were Dr Alina Sadaf, a paediatric oncologist from SKMCH&RC and a board member of Pakistan Society of Paediatric Oncology, and Dr Qudsia Uzma, Technical Officer for Reproduction, Maternal, Newborn, Child & Adolescent health (RMNACH) from the WHO Representative's Office in Pakistan.
