

Survivor's Story

Bisma's Journey from

Hyderabad to Lahore

I grew up in Hyderabad and I was studying architecture there when in 2022, I started feeling unwell. I had fever, night sweats, and swollen lymph nodes in my neck. I went to a doctor who advised biopsy and at the age of 23, I was diagnosed with Hodgkin's lymphoma, a type of cancer that develops in the lymphatic system. My treatment started at Shaukat Khanum's Karachi Diagnostic Centre and Clinic with chemotherapy. Initially, after four cycles of chemotherapy, my cancer seemed to be responding well to treatment. However, we found out soon that my cancer was very aggressive, and I was advised to go to the Shaukat Khanum Hospital in Lahore for further care.

There were moments during my cancer journey when I thought I was living my last day. At one point, it felt like electric shocks were running through my veins and the moment felt unbearable. I thought I won't make it, but I survived because my mother didn't give up on me and my doctors didn't give up.

In Lahore, I received a chemotherapy combination given for Hodgkin's lymphoma that has come back. After two cycles, I had a PET scan and the results showed that my cancer wasn't responding to treatment. After this, my doctor advised another combination of chemotherapy. The PET scan continued to show that my cancer was evading treatment. After exhausting all options, my doctor recommended a type of immunotherapy that wasn't available in Pakistan and had to be imported especially for me. After two months of treatment and another PET scan, we finally got good results! Following this, I underwent Autologous Stem Cell Transplantation, a procedure where a patient's own healthy stem cells (blood-forming cells) are collected before treatment and are given back to the patient after treatment. During this period, I had to stay in isolation. It was a very challenging time for me but with my family's support, I made it. Each patient's journey is unique but remember that you are the writer of your own story. If Shaukat Khanum didn't exist, I don't even know if I'd be here talking to you. I finished my thesis and all the requirements to graduate during treatment. I want to tell other patients not to give up-there is a future beyond cancer.

Cancer prevention is an important element of our mission at Shaukat Khanum Memorial Cancer Hospital & Research Centre and awareness about the risks of tobacco use is one of our major awareness campaigns. Awareness sessions were also organised for patients visiting our Walk-in Clinics.
